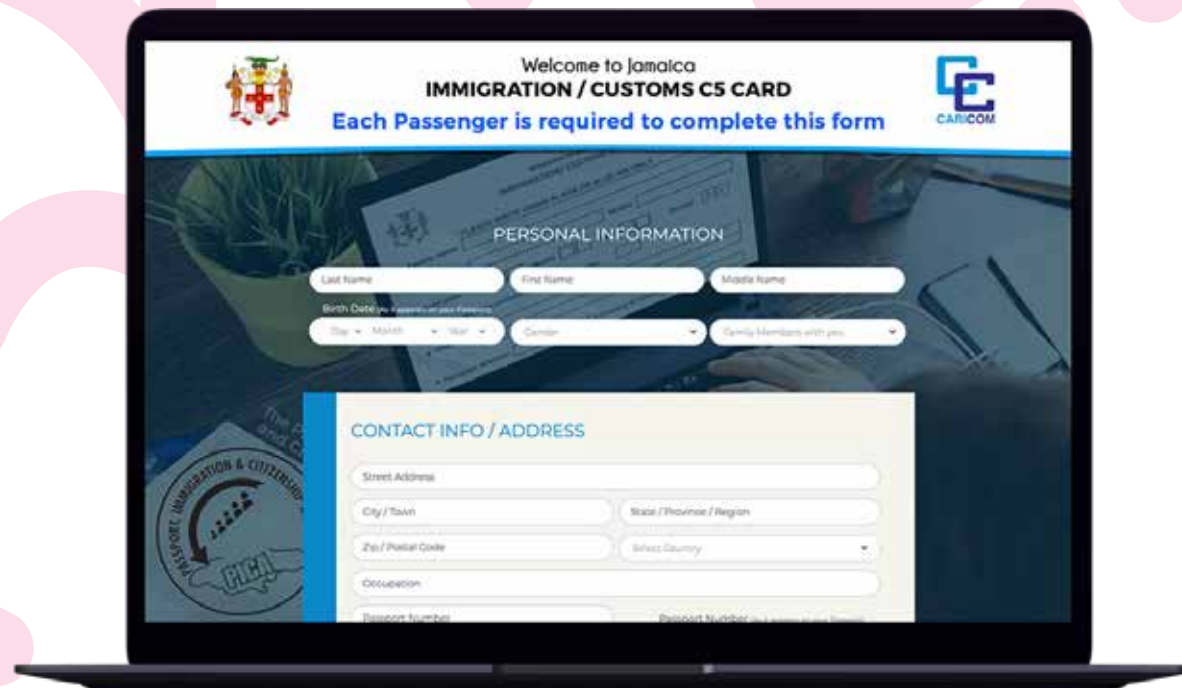
Clients are required to have a valid passport when travelling to JAMAICA, along with proof of anticipated departure from the island such as a return airline ticket.

Tax Deduction Status

U.S. Public Law 96-608 & JAMAICA's Exemption

On December 16, 1981, the U.S. Senate passed a protocol to the Income Tax Treaty with JAMAICA. According to the protocol, expenses incurred by a citizen or resident of the United States in connection with attendance at a convention, seminar or similar meeting held in JAMAICA shall be deductible for the purpose of taxation in the United States to the same extent as if the convention, seminar or similar meeting were held in the United States.

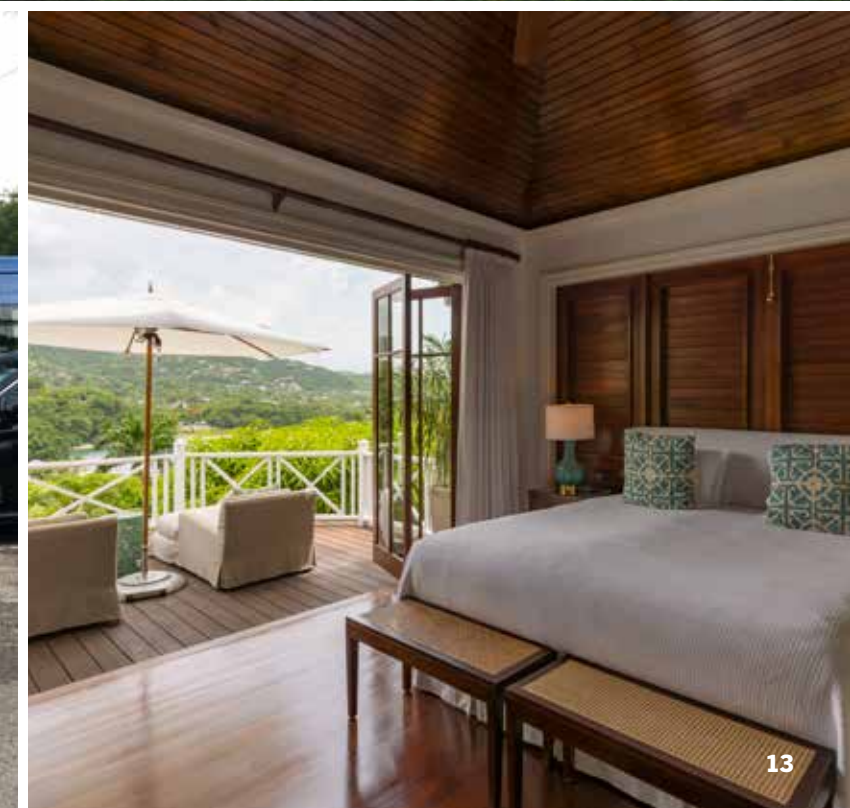

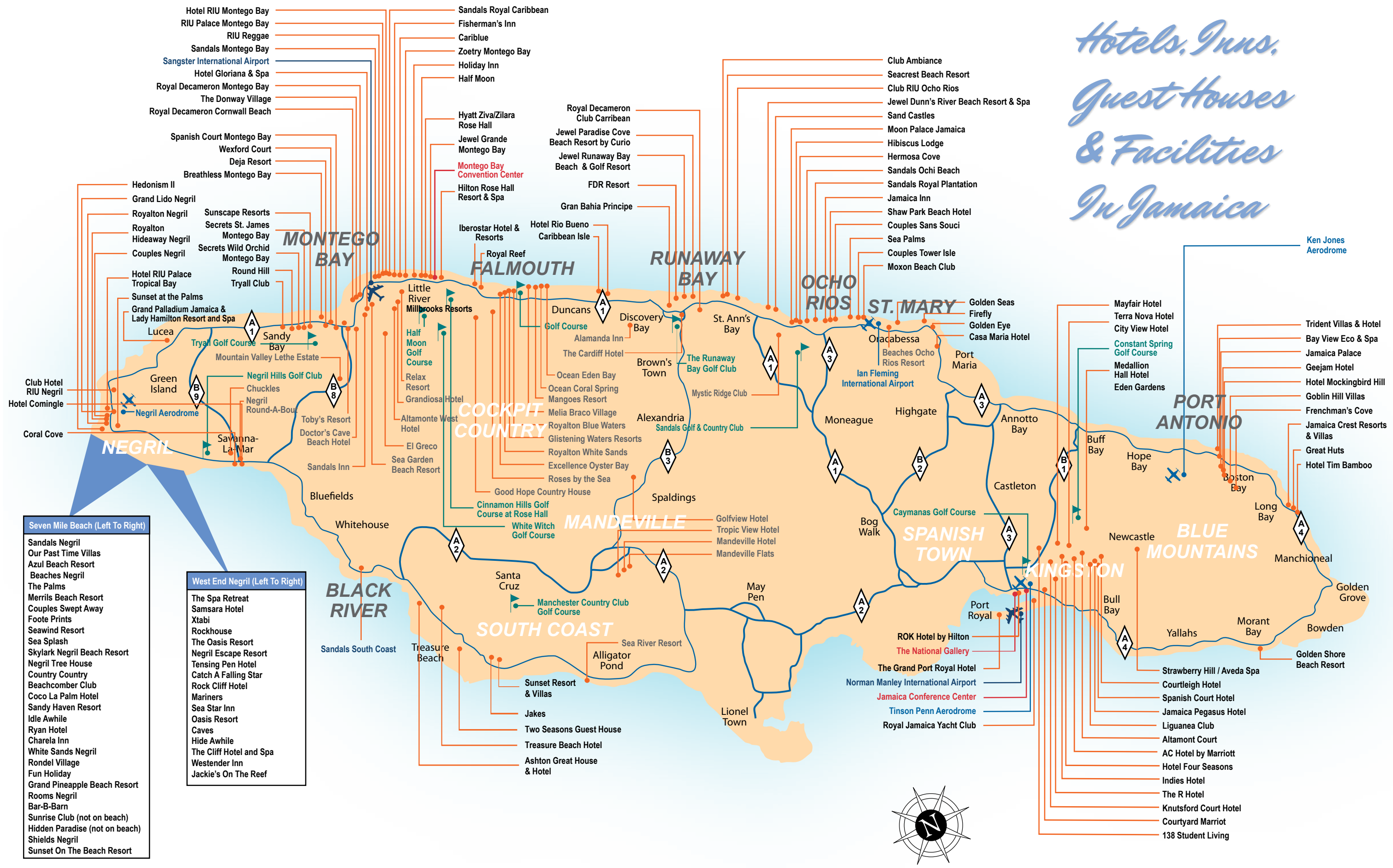
The Jamaica Conference Centre, located on the picturesque Kingston Waterfront, in the heart of the downtown business district, is a testament to Jamaican architecture and functional elegance, offering comprehensive facilities and services to meet the most stringent requirements of conference planners.

The Conference Centre is located on 220,000 sq. ft. of land, of which buildings account for 210,000 sq. ft. Although the Conference Centre was built to the specifications and standards of the United Nations, it is uniquely Jamaican. Local material and craft items have been used to enhance its magnificent architecture.

The Centre has five (5) conference rooms, three (3) caucus rooms, reception foyer, dining block, and several delegates lounges and offices. Each conference room is equipped with simultaneous translation facilities for six languages.

Conference Room #1, the largest, capable of accommodating up to 1,200 persons has an observers' gallery, as well as public and press galleries. There are major hotels as well as several reasonably-priced small hotels and guest houses within a short driving distance of the Centre.

BUSES

The local bus service provides an inexpensive way to travel, though it may provide an unusual experience for many visitors, as bus stands are rarely marked and vehicles do not follow strict schedules. Some resorts offer bus excursions to popular sites.

The Knutsford Express is a privately owned bus service that offers scheduled transportation between the various resort cities and towns via air conditioned vehicles with Wi-Fi included.

CLIMATE

JAMAICA enjoys a tropical climate, characterised by high temperatures and humid conditions year-round. Average temperature ranges from 66 degrees Fahrenheit (19 degrees Celsius) to 99 degrees Fahrenheit (32 degrees Celsius). Though it's known for warmth and sunshine, the island sees two rainy seasons from May to June and September to October. Also, hurricanes may pass over the island primarily from June to October. If it rains during your stay, don't worry. Most times, the short tropical showers provide a welcome break from the afternoon heat.

COMMUNICATIONS

JAMAICA is well connected to the rest of the world. Direct international telephone service operates in all areas, 24 hours a day, and telephone operators will gladly facilitate collect, third-party or credit card calls. E-mail and Internet access is available too, usually at hotels and parish libraries, but also at local Internet cafés. Three daily newspapers and five weekend newspapers will keep you in the know. Some hotels and gift shops receive international editions.

CREDIT CARDS

Major credit cards such as Visa, MasterCard and American Express are accepted throughout the island.

CURRENCY

The currency of JAMAICA is the JAMAICA Dollar, however, the U.S. Dollar is also accepted as legal tender for goods and services. Licensed "cambio" (exchange) centres and commercial banks are accessible in all resort areas. Official currency exchange rates vary daily, so it's advisable to shop around for the best rate.

CUSTOMS AND DUTY

United States residents who have been out of the country for 48 hours or more may take home items valued up to US\$800 once every 31 days without incurring duty. Adults may include 200 cigarettes, 100 non-Cuban cigars and one litre of alcohol. A second litre of alcohol is allowed duty-free if it is produced by a Caribbean Basin country. Family members who return home together may combine their personal exemptions on a joint declaration.

Canadian residents who have been out of the country for more than 48 hours can claim up to CAN\$300 worth of goods without paying duty if they carry the goods with them. After each absence of seven days or more, they can claim up to CAN\$800 worth of goods without duty. Except for tobacco products and alcohol, it is possible to send goods through mail but must enter Canada with tobacco and alcohol. Visit cbsaasfc.gc.ca for more information.

United Kingdom residents 17 or older may take home duty-free two litres of table wine and one litre of spirits or liquor, or two litres of fortified or sparkling wine or other liquors; 200 cigarettes or 100 cigarillos, or 50 cigars or 250 g of tobacco; 60 cc of perfume and 250 cc of eau de toilette; plus other goods worth up to £145. Travellers cannot group their allowances. Visit hmrc.gov.uk for more information.

DEPARTURE TAX

There is a \$35 departure tax that must be paid upon departure. However, airlines include this tax in their airline tickets.

DRIVING

In JAMAICA, drivers must keep to the left, although some flexibility is required to avoid collisions with pedestrians and domestic animals. The speed limit is 30 mph (50 kmph) in urban areas and 50 mph (80 kmph) on highways. Given the mountainous terrain, rural roads are often winding, bumpy and narrow. Tourists can rent cars in most major towns and cities, and, usually, clients must be no less than 25 years old in order to rent. The driver and all passengers are required to wear safety belts, and children under 3 years old must travel in infant carriers or child safety seats. All drivers are required to carry a valid licence. JAMAICA recognizes valid international driver's licences, but visitors from North America may use their country's licence for up to three months per visit, and United Kingdom residents may use theirs for up to one year.

DRUGS

In JAMAICA, the use, sale and possession of drugs such as cocaine, crack, ecstasy, heroin and any other controlled substance is illegal. Offenders are subject to severe punishment, including arrest, fines and/or imprisonment. The possession of up to two ounces of ganja (marijuana) has been decriminalised, but it is still not legal.

ELECTRICITY

The electrical supply in JAMAICA is 110 volts/50 cycles standard and electrical appliances use plugs that are two-pronged and flat (as in the United States and Canada). Bring along any adaptors or converters you might need. Most hotels will provide you with hair dryers, alarm clocks, radios and clothing irons, but make sure this is validated before travelling.

GETTING AROUND

Both JUTA and JCAL taxi operators are based at the hotels and these taxis are the most convenient mode of transportation but they are not always the cheapest. All registered taxis in JAMAICA are required by law to have red "PPV" licence plates. You are advised not to board any taxi operating illegally. Although taxis have metres, drivers will instead negotiate a fare with you. It is best to discuss this fare before boarding the taxi. The fastest and most economical taxis are those used by locals, called "route taxis"—cars that drive a designated course and pick up/drop off passengers at will. These are shared cabs that will usually pack several people willing to go on the same route.

NOTE: Some taxis are compensated separately by businesses in order to bring customers to their doors. If you request a driver take you to a specific location, and the driver attempts to persuade you to visit another place, be insistent that they take you where you want to go.

LANGUAGE

The official language of JAMAICA is English, although most locals speak Patois.

SAFETY

As with any place in the world, best practice should be to always remember to follow basic precautions to avoid possible predicaments. Keep all luggage in view at all times and your personal effects close to your body. Don't carry large amounts of cash and avoid wearing expensive jewellery outside of your resort.

TIME ZONE

JAMAICA falls within the Eastern Time Zone (UTC/GMT -5 Hours) and does not observe Daylight Savings Time. At approximately 18 degrees north of the equator, the island is located within the tropics. As such, it does not experience drastic seasonal changes in sunrise and sunset times. Year-round, the island averages between 11.5 and 12.5 hours of sunlight a day.

TIPPING

It is customary to leave a 10 to 15 percent gratuity at restaurants. Please make sure to check your bill, as some establishments will have already included the gratuity in your total.
